POST 60 HOSTS THE PATRIOT GUARD RIDERS

August 18, 2012 the American Legion Post #60 hosted the first State Members Convention of the Patriot Guard Riders of Idaho.

Who are the Patriot Guard Riders? They were formed in 2005 in response to the need to help shelter and protect fallen American heroes families against protestors. Their motto: Standing for Those Who Stood for Us.

They began their Convention by assembling at Kelly's Whitewater Park. They were wel-



comed by Mark Pickard, the developer of KWP, and heard from other members of their group at this time. They proceeded to place their flag on one of the flag poles and then lowered all other flags to half-staff, except the American Flag. A 21 gun salute and taps were rendered by American Legion Post #60, followed by the lowering of the American flag to half-staff in honor of a solider killed in Afghanistan and a firefighter killed while fighting a fire in Idaho.

Next up was an assembly at the American Legion before proceeding to ride to Council for a dedication of a Memorial in honor of an American Solider. The convention concluded with a meal provided by Post #60 and a night of camaraderie and fun.

ABOUT BOYS STATE — by Al Noyes

Boys State was founded in 1935 by two Legionnaires to counter the socialism-inspired Young Pioneer Camps. The first Boys State was held in Illinois State Fairgrounds.

Boys State here in Idaho started in 1943. For many years it was held at Boise State, then Gowen Field, College of Idaho, and presently at Northwest Nazarene University.

At Boys State, participants learn the rights, privilege, and responsibilities of franchised citizens. The training is objective and centers on the structure of city, county, and state governments. Boys State activities include legislative sessions, court proceedings, law-enforcement presentations, assemblies, choruses, and recreational programs.

Boys State programs currently exist in all Legion departments except Hawaii. As separate corporations Boys State programs vary in content and method of procedure, but each adheres to the same basic concept teaching government from the city to the state level.

Legion posts select high school juniors to attend the program. Our post selected TJ Hubbard to attend the 2012 Gem Boys State program. A better choice could not have been made. TJ represented our post, school, and community very well. TJ became the mayor or Elk City, which became the Capital City of Gem Boys State for the first time.
