

Update on Post 60's Electronic Reader Board

We began this process last May when we appeared before the City Planning and Zoning Committee (P&Z) to request approval for a Conditional use Permit (CUP) to place a new sign alongside Highway 55 to replace our old manually changed marquee sign. The City P&Z approved our CUP request and forwarded it to the Cascade City Council. We initially wanted to enter into a "joint ownership" deal where the City and the Legion had shared ownership of this small parcel of land. Much discussion and over ten appearances before the City Council has resulted in the Legion and the City agreeing to conduct a "land exchange". Simply put, the Legion will exchange with the City .13 acres on the eastern portion of our east parking lot for .13 acres on the western side of our west parking lot. This allows the Legion to be sole owners of the land where we intend to place the sign, and satisfies ITD's requirements. The City will have a public hearing on this land exchange on March 10, 2014; hopefully they will finally vote to approve this and also vote to approve the CUP. Once approved we apply for Title and legal ownership.
